Conversation with Jean Rouch by Ann **Macintosh** - 2004 - 40'

Shot throughout two years from 1979 to 1980 in some American Universities during summer schools, in his daily life in Paris meetings friends, at Chateau Thierry, a war place memory, at Monaco, where his father was Director of the Oceanographic Institute, at Marcilly his homestead place, at Santa Margherita his summerhouse in Italia which he shared with his former wife Jane in the seventies, these various conversations, let us share for a moment with humor and complicity the « world of Rouch ».

But the 18th of February Jean decided to stay in Niger for ever so Philippe came back alone to shoot Germaine's funerals.

Damouré, Moussa et Tallou . Rouch's family of Bandits in Niger - Berit Madsen et Anne Mette Jorgensen, Danemark – 2005 - 80'.

In 2003 two filmmakers went to Niger to make a film with Damouré Zika, Moussa Hamidou and Tallou Mouzourane. The former had seen the latter in numerous films that they had made together with Jean Rouch, over a period of more than fifty years. They would now try to 'walk in the footsteps of Jean Rouch' and make film together with them. They were curious to learn how Rouch's friends in Niger had experienced all these years of working with him and the cinema. Their film was going to be a survey into their collaborative methods. This film was recorded in 2003. Rouch died one year later on a desert road in Niger. At the time of the recordings he hadn't been to Niger for two years and his friends still hoped very much for his return. They were still involved in a film project together.
